

VMMC obtains Five-Star Rating for its Energy Efficiency and Conservation Measures

The Veterans Memorial Medical Center has earned another recognition from the Department of Energy for its energy efficiency and conservation practices during a random spot check conducted on July 6, 2022.

Based on the Spot Check Rating Sheet for the Inter-Agency Energy Efficiency and Conservation Committee (IAEECC) Advisory 2 Checklist furnished by Mr. Simon S. Leonor, Senior Science Research Specialist of the DOE, VMMC obtained a numerical rating of 95% which is equivalent to a five-star rating for passing all the parameters set by the department, namely: Institutionalization of Energy Efficiency and Conservation (ECC), Measures for Fuel Savings and Electric Saving Measures.

The spot check was conducted by the DOE in compliance with the provisions of Republic Act (RA) No. 11285, or the Energy Efficiency and Conservation (EEC) Act. It is also undertaken to determine government agency' compliance with the strict implementation of the Government Energy Management Program (GEMP), the government-wide program to reduce its monthly consumption of electricity and petroleum products through efficiency and conservation of electricity and fuel use of government vehicles, among others.
